What does the role involve?

You'll work with a Project Officer who will support you to create up to two stories a month.

You'll also be encouraged to come to our monthly reporter meetings, virtually and in person. It is an opportunity to develop confidence, skills and express your creativity!

What support will I receive?

- Two training days with our partners on our radar where we will provide you with equipment.
- Ongoing support from a Project Officer and option of support from Groundswell's Progression Team.
- No previous experience is needed!
