## Legal Education Course on Housing Rights for People with Complex Needs

**AIMS:** This course aims at building basic legal knowledge, skills and confidence to deal with private landlords and local councils on issues of housing and homelessness.

**FOR WHO:** The course is **for community groups and frontline workers** who deal with or support people in precarious housing situations. It focuses particularly on the challenges faced by people with complex needs in securing and maintaining tenancies.\* The course is basic and doesn't require any prior legal knowledge or technical training.
