Service Updates

Donations now accepted for entertainment/welfare packs: Including Drop-Off details

Financial Support

VRF Emergency Fund

In response to COVID-19 we have developed an emergency fund that is designed to offer flexibility in what you apply for as the full impact of the COVID-19 pandemic unfolds. To ensure that we continue to adapt as the needs of people experiencing homelessness change over the course of the COVID-19 crisis, we are keeping our survey <u>open</u> and would encourage you to complete it as you see needs shift. We will in turn do our best to ensure that the fund remains useful throughout this time.

What can I apply for?

The VRF Emergency Fund has three broad categories, you can apply for up to;

£150 for Basic Essential Needs

£400 for Overcoming Barriers to Support

£1000 for Securing Accommodation

However, in exceptional circumstances we will consider more.

How do I apply?

Applicants need to <u>register</u> on our Flexi-Grant system with a valid work email address before making an application.

If you're already a registered user, log in here.

Frontline Network Ideas Fund

The <u>Ideas Fund</u> remains open for applications during the Covid-19 pandemic. This funding can help you turn an idea that will improve the situation for people experiencing homelessness into a reality. The funding ranges from £200 to £10,000. You can use it to develop creative solutions and new ways of working.

Covid-19 Financial Support Briefing Summary

Our Frontline Network Partners at Target Housing have kindly shared Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council's <u>Financial Support Briefing</u>. The attached <u>document</u> is intended for frontline staff, summarising all financial support available during the Covid-19 put in place locally and nationally. Most information is on a UK level, so relevant to all of you. The document explains very well the support available for each specific issue and how to access it.

BBC Children In Need Emergency Essentials Funding

BBC Children in Need have launched an <u>Emergency Essentials Programme</u> which aims to support families with children and Young People by providing essential items such as beds, white goods. This fund is to provide the basic needs or services which are critical to a child's wellbeing. Applications must be made by a registered referrer, details how to do this are provided on their <u>website</u>.
